This funding will be used to

- 100 percent of students meeting regional benchmarks in Reading.
- 100 percent of students reaching National Minimum Standards (NMS) in NAPLAN Testing in Years 3 and 5 in all areas.
- Increase the percentage of students achieving a 'B' standard or above in English from 51% in Year 1 - 6 (2018) to 81% in Year 1 - 6 (2019)

Our initiatives include

- Supporting teacher aides to extend student learning in Literacy from Prep to Year 6. (Fisher, Frey & Hattie 2016).
- Increasing the use of Technology in the teaching and learning of Literacy. (Cooyar State School, Annual Implementation Plan, 2019).
- Providing professional development for teachers and school leaders to increase capability to initiate and implement innovative practices (Sharratt and Fullan, 2012).
- Provision of a Community Playgroup to support parents in the development of pre-school oral language, early literacy and social and emotional readiness for early educational settings (Advancing Education, DET, 2016).
- Revisiting, refining or revising the school pedagogical framework and embedding it as the shared language of teaching and learning (Cooyar State School, Annual Implementation Plan, 2019).

Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Developing, resourcing and implementing a professional development and coaching program to support teachers in data gathering, collation, analysis and use - **\$4,568**
- Providing TRS (Teacher Relief Scheme) to enable triads of teachers to engage in collaborative data inquiry, action learning, classroom visits and professional conversations and continue work with 'Putting Faces on the Data' (Lynn Sharrot) - **\$4,562**
- Investing in intensive Reading and Numeracy support for students at risk of not reaching regional benchmarks - **\$2,552**
- Financing, staffing and resourcing the Community Playgroup - **\$3,698**
- Procuring innovative and new technologies to increase access to engaging learning opportunities - **\$3,767**
